<p>-walks through the streets of London- sees people shoveling snow, throwing snowballs at each other, shopping in the markets, going to the bakeries</p>	<p>-the Christmas spirit is all around</p>
<p>-sees the people preparing for Christmas and enjoying the holiday</p> <p>-goes to the Cratchits' house- sees the family sharing a meager Christmas dinner, laughing, enjoying each other's company</p> <p>-hears Mrs. Cratchit call him "odious" and "unfeeling"</p> <p>-sees Tiny Tim with his little crutch</p>	<p>-people don't need a lot of money to be happy</p> <p>-family being together, sharing food, drink, music, memories, and love- that's what is most important</p> <p>-discovers what others think about him- they either feel sorry for him or detest him</p> <p>-learns that what he does has an effect on others (Tiny Tim); he can't just "keep his distance"</p> <p>-learns who the "surplus population" is</p>
<p>-sees miners, sailors, lighthouse workers celebrating Christmas even though they're living in difficult surroundings</p>	<p>-despite difficult conditions, people can still find happiness and celebrate the holiday together</p>
<p>-sees his nephew, Fred, and his wife and friends at a Christmas party- dancing, playing music, playing games together</p> <p>-hears Fred talking about Scrooge</p>	<p>-realizes he would have had fun if he'd gone to his nephew's</p> <p>-learns that Fred pities him</p>
<p>-sees the wretched children, Ignorance and Want</p>	<p>-discovers that if Mankind doesn't get rid of Ignorance and Want, society is doomed; society needs to take care of those who are less fortunate</p>
